

# **Good Standing Policy**

2024

The Good Standing Policy is part of our school's Behaviour Management Policy and is one of the ways South Thornlie encourages our students to consistently demonstrate respect for the values and rules at our school.

Students with Good Standing status are eligible to participate in a wide range of identified Good Standing activities and roles. A list of identified Good Standing activities is provided below. When an activity is classified as a Good Standing event, this will be clearly conveyed in notes and communications to parents and caregivers.

# **Good Standing Activities and Roles**

At South Thornlie Primary School, we have identified the following Good Standing events:

- In class Good Standing activities
- Interschool Sports
- Mega Play in the middle and end of each term
- Robotics (after school program)
- End of Year Reward Day in term 4
- Year 6 Camp (See further explanation below)
- Student Leadership roles (See further explanation below)
- Identified activities, incursions and excursions. Please note excursions and incursions are usually part of the curriculum and generally will <u>NOT</u> be good standing events unless otherwise identified and communicated with staff, parents and students prior to the event.

### **Good Standing Status**

Students are automatically granted Good Standing status at the start of the school year.

To maintain this status, students must always comply with school rules.

A student's Good Standing status will be withdrawn following consultation between Administration and the class teacher for the following reasons:

- Suspension
- Accumulated 90 minutes of detention

When Good Standing is lost, a Good Standing Passport will be provided to assist the student to earn back their Good Standing status.

Good Standing status is regained by a student demonstrating appropriate classroom and playground behaviours and making responsible choices for 5 consecutive school days with no suspensions or detentions.

Good Standing status is automatically reinstated at the start of each term.

#### Whole School Reward Day - Term 4

All students who maintain their Good Standing status throughout the year will be invited to participate in an End of Year Reward Day.

If a student loses their Good Standing status three times throughout the year they will **not** be permitted to attend the End of Year Good Standing Reward Day event.

If students don't have Good Standing at the time of the End of Year Rewards Day, but it's not their third loss, they can still attend.

#### Communication

On the loss of Good Standing status students and parent/caregivers will be informed.

Students who lose their Good Standing status will lose the right to attend any identified Good Standing activities until such times as their Good Standing status is regained.

#### **Year 6 Events and Good Standing**

If a Year 6 student loses their Good Standing status three times within a year, they will lose their camp and graduation dinner/excursion attendance privileges.

## Student Leadership and Good Standing

The first time a Student Leader, Student Ambassador or Faction Captain loses their Good Standing status, they will lose their badge and their right to represent the school until their Good Standing status is reinstated.

Should this occur a second time the right to represent the school as a Student Leader, Student Ambassador or Faction Captain will be removed for the remainder of the year.





Passport should be signed or stamped for each day attended with no detention/suspension.  * Days should be consecutive (aside from absences). If a detention or suspension is received a new passport should be issued.
