The University of Western Australia, Master of Clinical Audiology program, will be sending the graduates professional clinical audiologists to assess our students. The screening is highly recommended for 4-6 year old's and is available to all year levels. If you think your child may benefit from their hearing being checked and you would like them to be part of this program, please fill in the consent form and talk to the classroom teacher. Keep an eye out for the consent form coming home.

#### YEAR FIVE TELEPHONE INCURSION

On Monday, Year 5 students attended an incursion developed by John Paskulich from the Western Australian Historic Telecommunications Society. John brought an impressive display of telephones and communication devices, showing the changes in technology over time. John shared his knowledge with the students, detailing how telecommunications have evolved and changed over time.

John educated the students on the changes, from early communication strategies of carrier pigeons and smoke signals. The students explored the concepts of Morse code, telegrams, switchboards, telephones and mobile phones, comparing the similarities and differences in communication devices.

John shared photos of how telecommunications have evolved and allowed the students to interact with various models of telephones. Our students could ask questions about how telecommunications have evolved and clarify how the workforce has changed due to telecommunications and how technology has impacted how people communicate.





#### SCIENCE NEWS

This term in Science we are looking at Chemistry. Chemistry is all about the properties of materials and the way that they change.

One of the ways you can help your child in this area is to ask them to describe the things that they encounter. This means making observations by using your senses to experience things, what do they look like, taste like, sound like, feel like and smell like. Ask them to pay attention to how these things can change. This can be changes like how water can change from a solid to a liquid to a gas or simply how something changes when it is cut, like watermelon. Ask your children to help you cook dinner and look at how the different ingredients change throughout the process.


