




#### **TERM FOUR GEOGRAPHY COMPETITION**

Throughout Term 4, students from Pre-Primary to Year 6 participated in class-based competitions to see who could label a map the fastest. Pre-Primary students learned to label objects such as globes and maps. Students in Years 1 and 2 competed against each other for the fastest time in sorting natural, constructed, and managed landmarks. In Years 3 and 4, students raced to place the continents and the equator on a map in the quickest time, while those in Years 5 and 6 challenged themselves to label the continents, equator, tropics, and oceans as quickly as possible.

Each student competed against the clock and against themselves for the title of class champion. After determining the class champions, the winners faced off to identify the top students from Years 3 to 6.

At our week 6 assembly, Year 3 champion Andrew N competed against Year 4 champion Croft L. In an impressive showdown, Croft was crowned the South Thornlie Primary School Geography Scholar for Years 3 and 4, with Andrew finishing in a close second.

In another exciting contest, Year 5 champion Ethan R faced Year 6 champion Mohammed A, racing to label all of the continents, equator, tropics, and oceans. In a tight competition, Mohammed emerged as the 2024 Term 4 Geography Scholar, while Ethan delivered a strong performance, earning the silver medal.
